

Situated a mere 10 minutes from the city center, Fukuoka International Airport is known as one of the most conveniently located airports in the world, it also ranks fourth in Japan for air trade. 








Kitakyushu Airport on an artificial island






GDP in East Asia and Southeast Asia (US\$)


Fukuoka Exports (2016)

The total value of goods imported into Fukuoka: ¥2.39 trillion







Actively Promoting Next-Generation Industries

Automobiles

Northern Kyushu Automobile Industry Asia Advanced Base Promotion Project

The northern part of Kyushu has seen significant development in automobile manufacturing. With a concentration of auto giants, including Nissan, Toyota and Daihatsu, the region is the second largest producer of automobiles in Japan.

- Annual automobile production capacity for the cluster has reached 1.59 million vehicles.
- Several universities and technical schools in the prefecture have established major programs for automobile engineering.
- Toyota and Daihatsu have both opened R&D centers.

Hydrogen Energy Fukuoka Hy-Life Project

This project aims to realize a hydrogen energy-based society by undertaking broad-based research and development and personnel training for the production, storage, transportation and usage of hydrogen.

- Japan's largest collaborative industry-university-government project; members include progressive companies and research centers in the fields of hydrogen energy and fuel-cell technology.
- Aims to demonstrate the feasibility of a hydrogen energy-based society through the application of research-phase technologies in real-life situations.

Promotion of FCV (Fuel Cell Vehicle)

Fukuoka Prefecture aims to lead the realization of a hydrogen energy society, play the role of a base for development and production of FCV, strengthen the prefecture's industrial competitiveness, and establish a base for spreading FCV.

Biotechnology

The Fukuoka Bio Valley Project

With a view to building alliances with Asian countries, Fukuoka has been a driving force behind the formation of a large cluster of bio-venture start-ups, related companies and research institutions with core activities in biotechnology.

- More than 200 bio companies are located in Fukuoka
- More than 60 bioproducts have been commercialized.
- Bioindustry specialists have assisted with the development and commercialization of pharmaceuticals and health foods.





Medical and assistive devices

Project for the Promotion of Medical and Assistive Device Industries

The field of medical and assistive devices is expected to grow going forward. Under this project, companies, hospitals, universities and government agencies work together to provide institutional support in the form of expert advice from coordinators on legal compliance, device development, and so on.

 Sessions are held to match local companies with device manufacturers in the Tokyo region.



IoT technology

Fukuoka Prefectural IoT Acceleration Lab

A concentration of companies with advanced IoT technology including robotics, semiconductors and a programming language "mruby" is building in Fukuoka Prefecture. By taking advantage of the strength of the IoT technology of these companies, the promotion and creation of new products and services are increasing.

- Mining the concrete needs in various areas including welfare, medical, education, agriculture, forestry, and fishery industries.
- Supporting interaction and matching of companies in the prefecture, products/service development, and market exploration.
- Running the "workshop for IoT prototype verification" equipped with devices necessary for IoT prototype development in the Experimental Center for Social System Technologies.

Organic EL

Project for the Promotion of the Organic EL R&D bases

Fukuoka Prefecture aims to establish a major development base, developing/integrating center of organic EL, based on i3-OPERA which was established with the purpose of realizing/industrializing the seeds for world class, cutting-edge technology developed by Kyushu University.

Fukuoka Aircraft Industry Promotion Association

Fukuoka Prefecture takes actions for promoting attraction of aircraft-related companies and organizing the "Fukuoka Aircraft Industry Promotion Association" consisting of industry, academia and government, using the potential of Kitakyushu Airport that has a 24-hour flight operation.

 Mitsubishi Heavy Industries, Ltd. is planning to use Kitakyushu Airport as a sub-base for flight tests and aircraft parking of MRJ.

A Mecca for Higher Education

An outstanding center for higher education, Fukuoka Prefecture has over 125 thousand enrolled students including over 17,000 foreign students coming from over 108 countries and regions around the world.

- 37 universities (9 boast strong science and engineering departments)
- Fukuoka Prefecture has the second largest number of National University Students in Japan majoring in science
- 32,000 students graduate annually (one third major in science and engineering)

Foreign Human Resource Support

Fukuoka Prefecture supports the recruitment of qualified candidates from overseas as well as foreigners studying in Fukuoka.

The prefecture holds an annual employment expo, known as 'Job Fair', for foreign students where they can meet prospective employers. It also builds stronger ties between Japan and overseas countries by supporting the matching of businesses and talented individuals.




Overseas students studying in Fukuoka

Economic Benefits



Aside from its great location, one of the most convincing reasons to base a business in Fukuoka is the huge financial savings that can be made in comparison to other major cities such as Tokyo, Osaka or Nagoya.

Cost savings can be made across the board by setting up your business in Fukuoka. Labor costs and office rent are virtually less than half of Tokyo's.



Fukuoka Venture Market

Fukuoka Venture Market hosts a "Monthly Market" meeting where start-up companies can present business plans to potential partners and inventors.

- To date, more than 2,500 companies have participated, and over 70% of the companies have held business meetings.
- About 20% of companies who participated succeeded in securing business partners.


